The Ford Foundation's Building Institutions and Networks (BUILD) initiative is a five-year, US\$1 billion investment in the long-term capacity and sustainability of 300+ social justice and civil society organisations around the world. The initiative aims to strengthen these institutions, making them more effective at achieving their core missions, and reducing

inequality in all its forms. NIRAS conducted a developmental evaluation of the BUILD model. Designed to be participatory, iterative and adaptive, developmental evaluations are flexible, enabling programmes to track and understand outcomes as they emerge. The evaluation assessed the impact of the programme's approach and facilitated learning about the mechanisms and conditions for success and improved implementation. It covers BUILD in the US, in Europe and in the Global South. The NIRAS team collected quantitative and qualitative data, provided real-time feedback for learning and strategic planning, informed the next phase of BUILD, and tracked both emerging issues as well as longitudinal impacts. In the words of the Foundation: "Ultimately, our hope is that the evaluation will contribute to more nuanced evidence and compelling stories about BUILD as a grant-making approach, which will help shift the field of philanthropy toward providing more flexible, grantee-centered support."

Over a four-and-a-half-year period, NIRAS will be conducting a meta-evaluation of the Children's Investment Fund Foundation's (CIFF's) Renewable Energy Portfolio. The portfolio is currently comprised of eight investments representing five geographies which are focused on influencing and shaping climate and energy policy in middle-income countries, either through direct technical assistance to government entities or by strengthening civil society ecosystems. NIRAS is using a flexible and adaptive cycle for the evaluation to ensure the approach remains responsive to complex and evolving contexts and is capable of growing in line with the portfolio. The approach also relies on providing strategic M&E support and engagement with grantee organisations and programme staff to collect evidence of progress and collaboratively identify changes to improve performance. The assignment will deliver a range of products including investment level deep dives, light touch case studies, thematic portfolio-level evaluative synthesis reports and a suite of communications and learning materials.
